

Enjoy Komoro Castle Ruins' Autumn Leaves by Rickshaw

Komoro Castle, one of Japan's top 100, is a rare example of a castle that sits lower than its castle town. The castle no longer remains, but its stone walls still stand strong, and the many cherry blossoms and maple trees have earned it a special place in the hearts of nature lovers around the country. During autumn, enjoy the contrast of Komoro Castle's moss-covered ruins amid the brilliant red and yellow leaves above while riding in a traditional rickshaw.

On Saturdays during the festival period (10/29, 11/5 and 11/12), there will also be a special "Kacchu" open-air tea ceremony, performed by members of the Komoro Warring-States Armor Squad.
